There are many things that you may want to ask when your child begins school

Here are the answers to a number of frequently asked questions.

What if my child is sick?

- We ask that children are not sent to school unless fit and well enough to participate in all normal activities.
- If your child is unwell we ask that you contact the academy office as soon as possible explaining the reason for absence.
- If your child is taken ill at school or has an accident, the academy will notify you or a nominated contact as soon as possible.

My child has allergies, what should I do?

- Please inform the school of any allergies your child has. THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT.
- If your child develops an allergy or school information requires updating, please inform the school office as soon as possible.

What if my child is to be absent for a reason other than sickness?

• As a school we cannot authorise holidays during term time. If you are planning removing your child from school for a trip we ask that a holiday from is collected from the office and completed in order that we have a record in school.

What if my child is late?

• Learning at school starts from when the children enter the school building, therefore punctuality is very important. Our school gates close at 9.00am each morning. If children arrive late they will need to enter school through the main office and be marked as late on the school register.

What if the weather is bad?

• During times of inclement weather, children are supervised in their classrooms during break times. If there is snow, we will keep all parents updated using the text messaging service, our school website and twitter account.

Can my child bring sweets, toys or valuables to school?

- Children are not allowed to bring toys or valuables to school. This prevents arguments over ownership and removes any temptation to take other's property.
- As a health promoting school we do not allow sweets in school, children may purchase fruit, milk and toast during the mid-morning break as a healthy snack.

What if my child has a dental / medical appointment and will be late arriving?

• Where possible, the academy office and class teacher should be informed the day before the appointment.

What if I need to see the Headteacher or class teacher?

• There may be occasions when you wish to speak to the headteacher or class teacher. In these circumstances please contact the academy office and an appointment will be made at the earliest convenience or arrange a time with the class teacher after school. Alternatively, you can email the school office or class teacher.

What if my child forgets lunch, equipment etc?

• If your child forgets their P.E kit, reading book or lunch etc. it can be brought to the school office. It will be passed onto the child, or the class teacher as soon as possible.

Parental Involvement

As an inclusive community we very much welcome parents and visitors to our school.

Parents can help the school by volunteering to assist in the classrooms, under the supervision of the class teacher.

In addition, our F.R.O.G.S (Friends and Relatives of Gentleshaw School) are always looking for support and new members to support in arranging events and fundraisers.

If you are interested in helping in school on a regular basis then please contact the academy office.

Parental Involvement at Home

At home you can help your child in many ways:

- By playing games to help reading and spelling.
- Sharing a book or reading bedtime stories.
- Using a computer or tablet with your child.
- Outdoor games and sports.
- Reading letters that your child will take from school to home.
- Keeping yourself up to date with our school website and twitter account.
- Following your child's school events on the Ash Class Facebook page.

A Day at Gentleshaw School

School begins

The school gate opens at 8.40am each morning. From this time Ash Class enter the school with the rest of the children and make their way to the classroom. At this point your child will be met

by an adult and put their bag, coat etc. on their school peg. Morning work begins in each class at 8.40 until 9.00am each day. Children arriving after this will miss vital learning time and be marked as late.

Morning break

Children may like to purchase toast or juice from the Healthy tuck shop at a cost of 25p per item. We encourage children to drink water throughout the day and Gentleshaw reusable water bottles can be purchased on Schoolmoney pay for £3. We also have a French Friday, where you can purchase a croissant or pain au chocolat, for your child at a charge of 50p.

Lunch break

We encourage children to have a hot school meal which are funded by the Government for those children in reception, year 1 and year 2. However, children may bring a packed lunch if parents prefer. Parents of any children with food allergies or specific dietary requirements should inform the school.

School finishes at 3.00pm

Please collect the children from the Early Years area. It is important to inform the class teacher and/or school office if someone else other than the parent/carer will be collecting your child. If we do not know who is collecting your child then we will not be able to release them from the class.

At Gentleshaw we take pride in wearing our school uniform and ensuring that we look smart at all times. We expect all children to wear the agreed school uniform.

Uniform

In Summer

Red and white checked summer dress Short sleeved white shirt Grey shorts may be worn

In the events of accidents we can provide alternative clothing, which should be washed and returned to school, however we do encourage parents to supply their children with their own spare clothing/underwear.

Physical Education

T-shirt – red Black Shorts Black elasticised pumps (not laces) for PE lessons. Hooded sweatshirts and track suits for colder days

Drawstring PE kit bag

No jewellery should be worn to school, only stud earrings may be worn.

Long hair should be tied back for school.

Getting Ready for School

We want your child to feel happy and secure in their first days of school. As you will appreciate it is helpful to us and gives confidence to your child, if they can do certain things for themselves. These might include:

- Go to the toilet by themselves and wash their hands afterwards.
- Put on their coat and do it up.
- Put their own shoes on. We know shoelaces are difficult, the buckles can be too, but if they can have a go they will feel good about themselves.
